- 1 The heavens declare the <sup>1</sup>gl<sup>o</sup>ry of <sup>1</sup>God, \*  
and the <sup>1</sup>firmament <sup>1</sup>shows his <sup>1</sup>handiwork.
- 2 One day tells its <sup>1</sup>tale to an <sup>1</sup>other, \*  
and one night imparts <sup>1</sup>knowledge <sup>1</sup>to an <sup>1</sup>other.
- 3 Although they have no <sup>1</sup>words or <sup>1</sup>language, \*

and will save<sup>1</sup>those whose<sup>1</sup>spirits are<sup>1</sup>crushed.
- 19 Many are the<sup>1</sup>troubles of the<sup>1</sup>righteous, \*  
but the LORD will de<sup>1</sup>liver him<sup>1</sup>out of them<sup>1</sup>all.

- 1 My God, my God, why have<sup>1</sup> you for<sup>1</sup>saken me? \*  
and are so far from my cry  
and from the<sup>1</sup> words of<sup>1</sup> my dis<sup>1</sup>tress?
- 2 O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you<sup>1</sup> do not<sup>1</sup> answer; \*  
by night as<sup>1</sup> well, but I<sup>1</sup> find no<sup>1</sup> rest.
- 3 Yet you are the<sup>1</sup> Holy<sup>1</sup> One, \*  
en<sup>1</sup>throned upon the<sup>1</sup> praises of<sup>1</sup> Israel.
- 4 Our forefathers<sup>1</sup> put their<sup>1</sup> trust in you; \*  
they<sup>1</sup> trusted, and<sup>1</sup> you de<sup>1</sup> livered them.
- 5 They cried out to you and<sup>1</sup> were de<sup>1</sup> livered; \*  
they trusted in<sup>1</sup> you and were<sup>1</sup> not put to<sup>1</sup> shame.
- 6 But as for me, I am a<sup>1</sup> worm and no<sup>1</sup> man, \*  
scorned by<sup>1</sup> all and des<sup>1</sup> pised by the<sup>1</sup> people.
- 7 All who see me<sup>1</sup> laugh me to<sup>1</sup> scorn; \*  
they curl their lips and<sup>1</sup> wag their<sup>1</sup> heäds,<sup>1</sup> saying,
- 8 “He trusted in the LORD;<sup>1</sup> let him de<sup>1</sup> liver him; \*  
let him<sup>1</sup> rescue him, if<sup>1</sup> he de<sup>1</sup> lights in him.”

- 9 Yet you are he who took me<sup>1</sup> <sup>out of the</sup> <sup>womb,</sup> \*  
and kept me<sup>1</sup> <sup>safe upon my</sup> <sup>mother's</sup> <sup>breast.</sup>

- 1 God is our <sup>refuge</sup> and <sup>strength</sup>, \*

and though the mountains be toppled <sup>into</sup> the <sup>depths</sup> of the <sup>sea</sup>;
- 3 Though its waters <sup>rage</sup> and <sup>foam</sup>, \*
