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About the booklet

The liturgical colour of advent is purple, which signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. We also use purple to signify the royalty of the coming King, Jesus.

This booklet aims to give Sunday school aged children the opportunity to explore the themes presented during Advent using child friendly material. To Prepare, to experience the Journey and to watch for signs of Jesus.

The Adventure is guided each week by a Buddy, (local animal), who will walk them through each activity. Each week is filled with activities: Song, Craft, Snack, Bible Story.

Today we light the first Advent candle. This purple candle represents HOPE. It is also known as the Prophecy candle, as we remember the Prophets. Prophets are persons who told the world of things before they happened. They were guided by God to be God's voice to the people. Their words can either be a warning, bring hope or ask persons to change, all according to God's plan. Prophets had an important but difficult job. They gave the news then watched and waited for the great things to come.

One such prophet was Isaiah. He spoke to the people of Israel who were becoming restless and disobedient. He foretold that a baby will be born to save us all. Isaiah 7:14 says "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel." Sounds familiar? Yes, he predicted the birth of Jesus hundreds of years before the first Christmas. He told who will give birth and what he (the baby) will mean to us. Immanuel means "God is with us" Even by his name we are told that Jesus is the earthy form of God. God walking among us.

Meet Steve a Buffalypso!




Buffalypso was developed in Trinidad by Dr. Stephen Bennett, in the 1960s. At that time, there were little or no tractors and trucks working in the fields. Animal power was popular as oxen, mules and donkeys were used as beasts of burden. Sadly, pests came and got these animals sick. Many died. Dr. Bennett developed a new breed of animal which could stand against the pests. This new animal brought HOPE to the farmers. The Buffalypso was a new animal that the pest couldn't get sick! These animals were resilient (strong), and they were better than the previous work animals. Their meat and milk are exported (sold) all over the world.

The horns of the Buffalypso are curved. These horns remind us that in life there will be curves, challenges that we do not think we can handle, but with Jesus as our HOPE we can withstand and overcome those challenging curves of life and become resilient.

Just like the Buffalypso brought HOPE to the farmers, we think of Jesus who brings HOPE to mankind. With this HOPE we know that things will get better. We are confident that Jesus will make us stronger to face the pests of the earth and become better than we were before!



Let's meet some of the prophets who foretold the coming of Jesus the Messiah - the hope and restoration of mankind - years before he was even born.



Meet Micah

Micah is recognized during Advent for being the one who told us **the location** of Jesus' birth. Approximately 700 years before it even happened.

Micah 5:2 - But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days.



Meet Isaiah

He is remembered during Advent for being the prophet who told us that Jesus' birth will be special and impossible. A virgin will give birth. He reminds us 740 years before the birth, that with God all things are possible.

Isaiah 7:14: Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman^[a] is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel.



Meet Hosea

He is remembered at Advent for his prophecy that <u>Jesus will spend many years in Egypt</u>. This comes to pass in Matthew 2: 11-13.

Hosea: 11:1- When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.



Meet Jeremiah

We remember him at Advent because he prophesized boys under 12 would be killed to <u>protect Jesus</u> 630 years before it happened.

Jeremiah 31:15: Thus says the LORD: A voice is heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping. Rachel is weeping for her children; she refuses to be comforted for her children, because they are no more.

Recipe

Grains Salad

1 cup or 1 can each of three beans of your choice (red beans, chickpeas, bodi, black beans etc.)

3 ears or 1 tin corn (sweet corn is better)

1 small red onion

Celery

Black pepper

Sweet pepper (different colours if you can)

1 cucumber

Juice of 1 lime

salt

Method

Precook beans. If using canned beans, drain off liquid. Place all beans in a large bowl. Remove seeds and devein peppers then dice. Peel and dice cucumbers. Chop onions and celery. Add all to beans. Mix. Add salt and black pepper to taste. Add lime juice. Toss salad. Refrigerate until ready for use.



Recipe

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup dried sorrel
- 11/2 cups water
- 2 1/2 cups ketchup
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 2 teaspoons pepper sauce
- 2 tablespoons corn-starch (Divided)
- 2 tablespoons water (Divided)




INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Bring 1 1/2 cups water to a high boil
- 2. Add dried sorrel to water then take off heat and leave to steep till cool
- 3. When cooled, strain sorrel, making sure you get 1 cup of sorrel liquid
- 4. In a pot, on medium heat, add ketchup, molasses, vinegar, soy sauce, garlic powder, onion powder and pepper sauce
- 5. Add sorrel liquid
- 6. Combine and leave to simmer on medium-low for about 10 minutes. Stirring occasionally.
- 7. Mix 1 tablespoon of corn-starch with one tablespoon of water, making sure no lumps are left in the mixture
- 8. Add corn-starch mixture to pot and combine.
- 9. Leave to simmer another 8 10 minutes
- 10. If you would like it thicker (should be sticking to the spatula and not just running off) repeat the corn-starch mix and add to pot.
- 11. Once the desired thickness is achieved (with no burning), pour into a clean bottle.

This was one of the signs that Jesus came for everyone not just the rich but also the poor and outcast, to EVRYONE!

Ron is a Tufted Coquette hummingbird, one of the 19 species of hummingbirds that can be found in Trinidad and Tobago. They are the only birds that can stay in one place during flight. They can fly forwards, backwards and even up-side down! When in a dive their tiny wings beat 70 times in a second. 


Luke 2:8-14

In his mother's belly he jumped for joy when Mary came close because he knew that Jesus was in Mary's belly on his way!

³⁹ In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, ⁴⁰ where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴² and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³ And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴ For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵ And blessed is she who believed that there would be^[e] a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

Recipe: Trini Black cake (non-Alcoholic)

FOR THE CAKE

- 1 lb unsalted butter
- 1 lb sugar
- 8 eggs
- 1 tsp lemon essence
- 2 tsp lime rind (zested)
- 2 tsp almond essence
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 lb all-purpose flour
- 4 tsp baking powder
- 2 tsp mixed spice
- 1/2 tsp grated nutmeg



- 1 lb pitted prunes
- 1 lb raisins
- 1 lb currants
- 2 bottles non-alcoholic red wine or grape juice

THE BROWNING

- 1 lb brown sugar
- 1/2 cup boiling hot water

One day before:

Chop all the fruits and place in a large bowl. Pour non-alcoholic wine to cover fruits and leave in a cool corner. One day should be good if the fruits soak up the wine

Baking day - Blend Fruits:

Pour the soaked fruit and remaining juices into a blender and blend until thick and chunky or to desired consistency.

Prepare The Browning:

Burn the sugar until it has caramelized and add hot water gradually. Let this mixture cool.

Preparation

- 1. Preheat oven to 275F
 - 2. Cream the butter and sugar.
 - 3. Add eggs one at a time, mixing in
 - 4. Add lemon zest, almond essence and vanilla



- 5. Mix and sift flour, baking powder, mixed spice, and nutmeg.
- 6. Gradually add sifted ingredients to creamed mixture
- 7. Mix in fruit base and 'browning' prepared earlier
- 8. Pour batter into greased baking dishes
- 9. Bake for 3 hours
- 10. Once removed from the oven let cool

The birth of Jesus brought a love that the world never experienced before. This is a love that God calls us to practice. This love seeks nothing in return, you don't have to do anything to gain this love. You can be anyone, rich, poor, sinner or saint, Jesus shows us that he loves everyone the same. In his time on earth, Jesus healed persons no matter their background. He preached and fellowshipped with persons who normally would be forgotten. His birth demonstrated God's ultimate love for us (John 3:16). Jesus was born with a mission to spread love throughout the earth.

Loving all persons is NOT a difficult task. Firstly, there are many people to love! We have our family, friends, neighbours, teachers, classmates, principals and even persons we may not like. 

What you will need

- Light-coloured construction paper
- · Yellow construction paper · Markers or pens
- · Stick glue · Scissors
 - Cut out stars for tree toppers,

Instructions

- 1) On strips of paper write ways you can show love this season. Include the people who you want to show love as well. (Even people you may not like)
- 2) Place your strips on top of the sheet of construction paper to form a tree. Cut off the ends of strips to make shorter pieces if only one- or two-word answers are written on it.
- 3) When you have your pieces in order and shaped, glue them onto the page.
- 4. Top with a star.
- 5. Write your name and "Love Tree" at the bottom

Recipe:

Donut Wreath

What You will need:

- 3 purple birthday candles, 1 pink birthday candle, 1 white birthday candle
- Green food colouring
- Donut Recipe (Store bought can work as well)
- Icing Sugar

Donut Recipe (Makes 16)

INGREDIENTS

FOR DOUGH

- 1 c. whole milk
- 1/4 c. plus 1 tsp. granulated sugar, divided
- 1 packet (or 2 1/4 tsp.) active dry yeast
- 4 1/2 c. all-purpose flour, plus more for surface
- 1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- 6 tbsp. melted butter
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- Canola or vegetable oil, for frying

Directions

- 1. Grease a large bowl with cooking spray and set aside. In a small, microwave-safe bowl or glass measuring cup, add milk. Microwave until lukewarm, 40 seconds. Add a teaspoon of sugar and stir to dissolve, then sprinkle over yeast and let sit until frothy, about 8 minutes.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk together flour and salt. In a large bowl, whisk together remaining sugar, butter, eggs, and vanilla with a wooden spoon. Pour in yeast mixture, mix to combine, then add in dry ingredients, stirring with a wooden spoon until a shaggy dough forms. Transfer to a lightly floured surface and knead until elastic and only slightly tacky, adding more flour a teaspoon at a time if needed, about 5 minutes.



- 3. Form into a tight ball then place dough in oiled bowl and cover with a clean dish towel. Let dough rise in a warm spot in your kitchen until doubled in size, about 1 hour.
- 4. Line a large baking sheet with parchment. Punch down dough, then turn onto a lightly floured work surface and roll out into a $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick rectangle. Using a doughnut cutter or 3" and 1" biscuit cutters, punch out your doughnuts. Re-knead scraps together and punch out as well. Place doughnuts and holes onto baking sheets, cover with dish towel, and let rise again, about 40 minutes more.
- 5. Line a large baking sheet with paper towels. In a large pot or fryer over medium heat, heat 2" oil to 350°. Cook doughnuts, in batches, until deeply golden on both sides, about 1 minute per side. Holes will cook even faster!
- 6. Transfer doughnuts to paper towel-lined baking sheet to drain and cool slightly. Dip into glaze, then place onto a cooling rack (or eat immediately!).

Make Glaze

- 7. Make glaze: In a large bowl, whisk together milk, powdered sugar, and vanilla until smooth and 2 drops green food colouring.
- 8. In a small bowl $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of white sugar. 1 drop of red food colouring.
- 9. Wreath Assembly
 - 1) Choose your doughnut and dip in the green glaze
 - 2) Dip Glazed doughnut in red sugar dust
 - Place your candles in the Advent order clockwise. (Purple, Purple, Pink, Purple)
 - 4) Enjoy

Christ Candle

Its Christmas day! Today we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For the last four weeks we looked at the preparation for this day. The birth of Jesus presented God in human form. This candle is placed at the centre of the other four candles, because it represents the fact that Jesus is the centre of our lives, and only in Him we will find true hope, peace, joy and love.

Nativity Craft - Manger Scene

Materials

- 6 Large craft (pallet) sticks
 Utility knife
- Stick glue Paint, blue, orange, white, and yellow
- NewspaperPaintbrushes
- Water
 Paper towels
- Twine
 Thin gold ribbon or gold embroidery thread
 Markers

Preparation (For Parents)

- 1. Cut the pallet sticks into pieces of different sizes.
- 2. Have three uncut sticks to make the roof and base
- 3. Cut three sticks at about the 2/3 mark. The longer pieces will make the sides of the manger, plus the angel; the short pieces will be Mary and Joseph and the baby Jesus. Keep the short lengths in one Ziploc bag and the long lengths in another.


Instructions

- 1. Do the painting first. Take three short sticks. For the first one, take your thumb and place it near the top of one stick so that the top of the stick still shows and a little of the back. Paint blue around your thumb. That will be Mary. Put her aside.
- 2. Wash out your brush using the water and your thumb. Dry the brush with paper towels.
- 3. Repeat step one with your thumb and another short stick, only this time use orange paint. This will be Joseph. Put him aside.
- 4. Wash out your brush and your thumb and dry the brush with paper towels.
- 5. For the last short stick, place your thumb over the entire rounded top, which will be Jesus' head. Paint yellow under your thumb. Put Jesus aside.
- 6. Wash out your brush and your thumb and dry the brush with paper towels.
- 7. Take one of the three long sticks to create your angel. Do as you did with Jesus, covering the whole top of the stick with your thumb. Paint white underneath. Lay the angel aside.

- 8. Clean up your brushes and hands.
- 9. To create the manger, start with two uncut sticks, crossing them very close to the top. Glue them together using stick glue.
- 10. Add two of the long-cut sticks to create the sides, gluing them to the roof. Angle them outward slightly.
- 11. Add the third uncut stick to make the base. Glue it to the long cut sticks at the bottom.
- 12.By now, your stick characters should be dry. To Mary's and Joseph's faces, add one little line that looks almost like a checkmark to make each an eye.

 13.Glue their bases to the bottom stick from behind and angling them in slightly.
- 14. Give the baby Jesus and the angel two loops for eyelashes.
- 15. Glue the baby Jesus to the base and the angel to the X in the roof.
- 16. Wrap a bunch of twine around Jesus to make his swaddling clothes. Extend two short pieces of twine from Mary to the manger and Joseph to the manger, to look like their arms. Glue the twine down.
- 17. Wrap some gold thread around the angel's neck and above the head to create a halo. Glue it in place.
- 18. Tie a big loop around the \boldsymbol{X} in the manger top so that you can use the manger on your Christ
